

Accountancy skills shortage in the Philippines: could accounting technicians be part of the solution?



- High level of Filipino accountants who emigrate
- Rise of freelancing and remote work
- Decline in new accounting students
- Growing demand for accountants globally
- Growth of business process outsourcing (BPO)
- Lack of work-ready accounting graduates

Key elements of AAT collaboration with PICPA in the Philippines to train Accounting Technicians.

1. Building Market Awareness of the value and need of the accounting sector and wider economy of Accounting Technicians. PAO and AAT working together, with PAO using their membership and taking the lead on in-country activity.

2. AAT Accountancy

PAO development of a scheme supported by AAT at the agreed level.
