Key stats

Education and Skills

244 million children and youth (ages 6–18) are out of school globally (UNESCO, 2023). Girls are more likely than boys to be excluded from education in Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia.

Only 1 in 4 countries has achieved gender parity in upper secondary education (UNESCO).

People with disabilities are 2.5x more likely to have never attended school compared to their peers (UNICEF, 2021).

Digital Inclusion

2.6 billion people (1 in 3 globally) remain offline (ITU, 2023).

Women are 19% less likely than men to use mobile internet in low- and middle-income countries (GSMA, 2023).

People in rural areas are 2x less likely to have internet access than those in urban areas.

Workforce Participation

- Globally, women's labour force participation rate is about 47% compared to 72% for men (ILO, 2023).
- Closing gender gaps in labour force participation could boost global GDP by \$12 trillion by 2025 (McKinsey).
- Youth (ages 15–24) are 3x more likely than adults to be unemployed (ILO, 2022).
- Persons with disabilities face an employment gap of 30–50 percentage points compared with non-disabled workers (World Bank)

Other Inclusion Dimensions

- LGBTQ+ workers face up to 30% lower earnings in some countries and higher rates of harassment and job discrimination (World Bank, 2022).
- Refugees: Of the 43 million displaced people worldwide, less than 1 in 5 are in formal employment (UNHCR, 2023).
- Language: Around **40% of the global population** do not have access to education in a language they understand (UNESCO).
