
CASE STUDY: English for Nursing, 2year syllabus for Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland – Medical University of Bahrain

Following detailed guidance from the Language and Culture Unit (LCU) at RCSI Bahrain, we re-arranged the content of the English for Care and the English for Nurses courses to match the syllabus taught at the university to undergraduate nursing students.

English for Care was studied by Year 1 students and English for Nurses by Year 2. The courses strengthened and extended existing English language programmes and supported students in their degree courses which are taught in English.
